TRAVEL NOTES

- First day of all classes will run from 9AM to 5PM. Second day will run from 9AM to 3PM.
- Participants need to arrive on Sunday and will depart on Tuesday after 3PM. Please arrange flights accordingly.
- Participants will need to arrange their own transportation to and from Tuttnauer USA in Hauppauge, NY.
- Islip/MacArthur airport is approximately 15 minutes from the Hampton Inn and Tuttnauer. Two alternatives would be LaGuardia or JFK International, which are approximately 1 hour from the Hampton Inn and Tuttnauer.
